

Bimblebox: Nature Refuge purchased by Federal Government, 2004õ



õ to be (largely) destroyed by coal mine approved by State Government, although with offsets.



New Australian Government in 2013 says it will review marine reserve zoning of previous year to mollify fishing interests

Park boundaries change, but no-take zones are all up for review





## Actual PADDD Lifting prohibitions... downgrading

Queensland in 2013 allowed livestock into 5 national parks and 8 national parks awaiting gazettal, for %drought relief+

All were removed by June 2014

However another 16 national parks have grazing leases on them yet to expire, as a concession during purchase and gazettal

Regional parks and nature refuges in Queensland are often subject to livestock grazing

### Actual & potential PADDD **Downsizing**

Some states changed laws to allow up to 99 year leases of national park areas for tourist businesses- an effective excision/downsizing when they happen.






#### **Actual PADDD?**

#### **Turning off transfers of state land**

Queensland in 2012-13 stopped transfer of state forests to national park






#### **Actual PADDD?**

#### **Turning off transfers of state land**

Queensland removed the IUCN VI designation of state forests over many thousands of ha





### Not exactly PADDD **Stalled transfers of purchases**

Queensland again, 12 properties purchased since 2008 with federal government funding to become new national parks have been held back from gazettal pending a review of %appropriate tenure+

Purchase contracts require gazettal with 24 months.

These national parks in waiting have been leased for livestock grazing.







Henbury: Purchased by Fed Govt for private proponent ...




Henbury: õ who went bankrupt before covenant recorded. Resold as cattle property, with ~20% under covenant.

Limmen: Listed as National Park, prior to, but not actually gazetted until 2011.






#### Looks like PADDD

#### Jumping the gun

Limmen: Listed as National Park, prior to, but not actually gazetted until 2011. Proposed area larger than gazetted area, but not formally a degazettal.

#### **Correcting the record**

South Australia: 80,000 ha of national parks where mining not excluded in gazettal, reviewed for application of IUCN categories...

#### **Correcting the record**


South Australia: Categories downgraded, but nothing materially changed





## PADDD in context Rollback of land clearing laws

Queensland in 2013 undid restrictions on land clearing over millions of ha. Will now require more investment in protected areas to achieve same goals.
