



2. Funding mechanisms

a) Call for Proposals: CSOs as executing entities

- 1. 1996 to 2014
- 2. Proposals reviewed by external evaluators and technical advisory committee
- 3. An average of 50 projects selected per year (US\$2.5-3.0 million per year)
- 4. Trend to move from I-year to 4-year projects
- 5. Strong emphasis on capacity-building and financial sustainability





b) Fund for Protected Areas: a successful privatepublic partnership in México

1997: US\$16.5 mi, I donor, 10 PAs Assigned personnel and basic costs




2014: US\$76.5 mi, 14 donors, 24 PAs Strategic and innovation projects Emergencies fund




C) Monarch Fund; direct benefit for communities within the 30,000 acre core zone of the MBBR

2000: Payments for ecosystem services for forest owners in core area of the Reserve



2014: US\$7.5 mi endowment, with 1:1 match on income from CONAFOR as direct payment to participating ejidos

4. Conclusions

- C6 combines:
 - CSO capacities and permanence
 - Resilience of public-private partnerships
 - Benefits the direct stakeholders linked to the natural resources
 - Watershed perspective on both coasts
- C6 benefits from synergies of different financial mechanisms
- C6 is a living practice of virtuous confluence of resources and technical support for conservation at a landscape scale

4. Conclusions (contd.)

Additional models being evaluated:

- Private lands conservation schemes in NW and NE México's last wildlands of the Sonoran and Chihuahuan Deserts (Fondo Serranía del Burro and Cuenca Los Ojos).
- Rancher's initiative, the Alianca do Terra model of productive stewardship in NE Mexico and SE Texas
- Amigos de Calakmul, building on the experience of Fondo Monarca
- Ecolodge, a business model that pays for coastal ecosystems conservation through high-end nature tourism infrastructure and destinations
