AGENDA FOR ACTION

- INTERNATIONAL-mainstream conservation into development-> local ownership, local benefits
 - SDGs: use 2020 AICHI Targets: PROTECT- 17% of terrestrial ecosystems esp. biodiversity hotspots -10% of marine ecosystems (MPAs)
 - HALVE the rate of biodiversity losses by 2025
 - A CARBON TAX

Agenda for Action- Domestic

- ▶ EDUCATE, ADVOCATE, MOBILIZE
 - -All politics is local
 - -The public moves the political
- Carbon tax, MPAs, protected areas
- Incorporate ecosystem services into decisions
 - Rights based decisions. Increase value and benefits to local communities
- ▶ Small changes by the many=BIG IMPACT

ADVOCACY STRATEGIES

- -align health interests with environmental actions/outcomes
- -have specific asks
- -focus
- -an emotional impact>>intellectual message
- -Be persistent; mobilize the public→political


