



Overview: Indonesia

Indonesia

- 252.8 million people (52% urban)
- Per capita income of USD 3,475
- 28 million living below the poverty line

Riau

- Forestry represents 6.9% of total economic output
- APRIL alone has generated 90,000 jobs
- Upswing in economic activity has reduced poverty by 30%











APRIL Managed Land

130 million ha of forest in Indonesia

74 million ha set aside for production forestry

10 million ha allocated to forest plantation including pulp and paper

1 million ha – APRIL's plantations, including long-term suppliers

480,000 ha used for plantations


(**0.4%** of total forest area in Indonesia)

> 250,000 ha HCV forest conserved and protected the rest for Infrastructure and community




Tesso Nilo National Park

Tesso Nilo National Park Forest Cover Monitoring Series 2000-2014




The Cost of Neglect


- Degradation occurs when forest is left unmanaged


- 1 for 1 conservation commitment
