






- Indigenous Peoples have traditional wisdoms

- Many of them already united in organization and network to develop solidarity inter IPs, and capable to organize supports from others.








Story in Ancestral Domain of Indigenous Lusan, Muara Komam, Paser – West Kalimantan

ICCAs Documentation and Protection efforts

4,246,845 hectares community territories has been mapped, → **3,380,021** hectares of which is forest area

(265 maps) 2,402,222 hectares have been submitted to the Geospatial Information Agency (BIG)

Recommendations

- The UNDRIP should be a key international standard and framework for ICCAs protection
- Review and reform all laws and sectoral regulations that violated Constitution (UUD) of 1945.
- Review and renegotiate all the existing contracts and concession permits on natural resources exploitation (logging, mining, plantation) in ancestral domain of IPs.
- Implement free, prior, and informed consent (FPIC) principles for all development projects in IP's ancestral territory.
- Accelerate the process of recognition and protection of IPs Rights
 \(\rightarrow \) Law on IPs
- Strengthen the National ICCAs Consortium for documentation & promotion of conservation areas by indigenous and local communities
- Support in implementation of community conservation plans to sustain traditional governance of ICCAs
- Integrating the IP's map on One Map policy
- Direct support to indigenous community and IPs organization to build their capacity in revitalizing and enforcing their customary law and institution to govern their self as a community and manage their teritory and resources as an autonomous unit.
