



## What has helped progress marine reserves at CCAMLR?

- Country champions:
- Ross Sea (US, New Zealand)
- East Antarctica (Australia, France, EU)
- Strong science / focus on science
- Proposed protection of representative areas where data is scarce





## What has hindered progress for meaningful, large-scale marine reserves at CCAMLR?



- Geopolitics (key issue is Russia vs. Western nations)
- Fishing interests
   (mainly China, Norway, Japan)
- No common approach for duration,
   review and/or monitoring/management
- Multiple-use approach (versus no-take)
- Diminishing scale

### Key recommendations for a new UN implementing agreement based on experience of CCAMLR

- Should be founded in the precautionary principle and ecosystem approach
- Must provide a mechanism that enables the creation of large-scale
   MPAs including fully protected, no-take marine reserves
- Must enshrine the concept of permanence
- The agreement could include language regarding review and reporting requirements and not duration and sunset clauses.
- Consensus-based decision making is a double-edged sword
