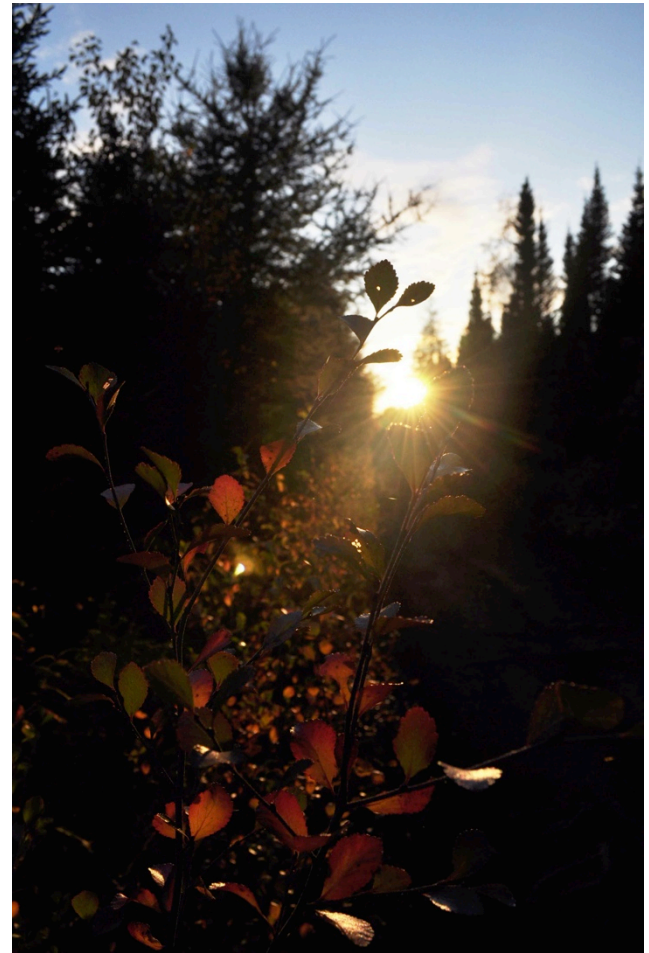

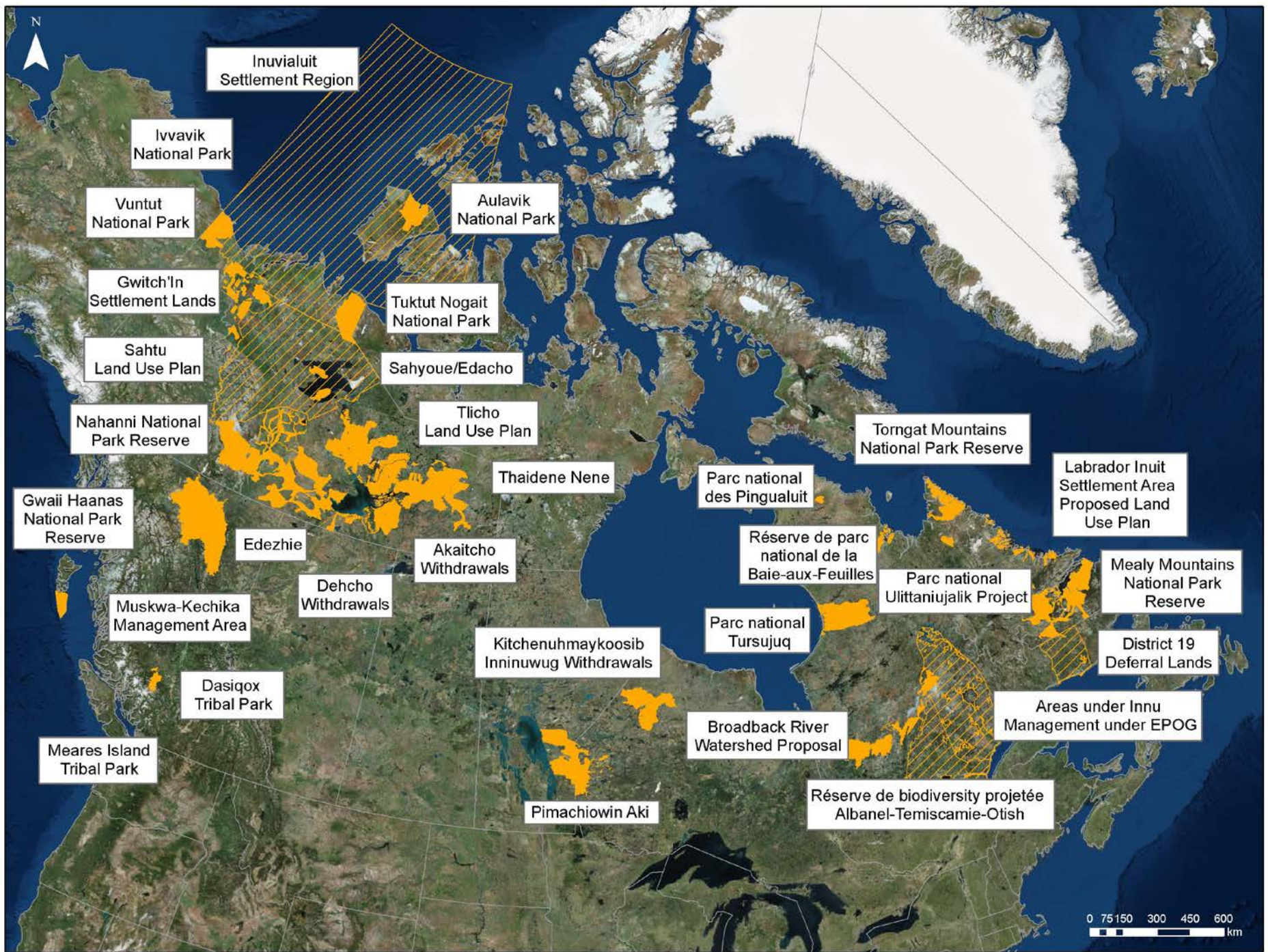


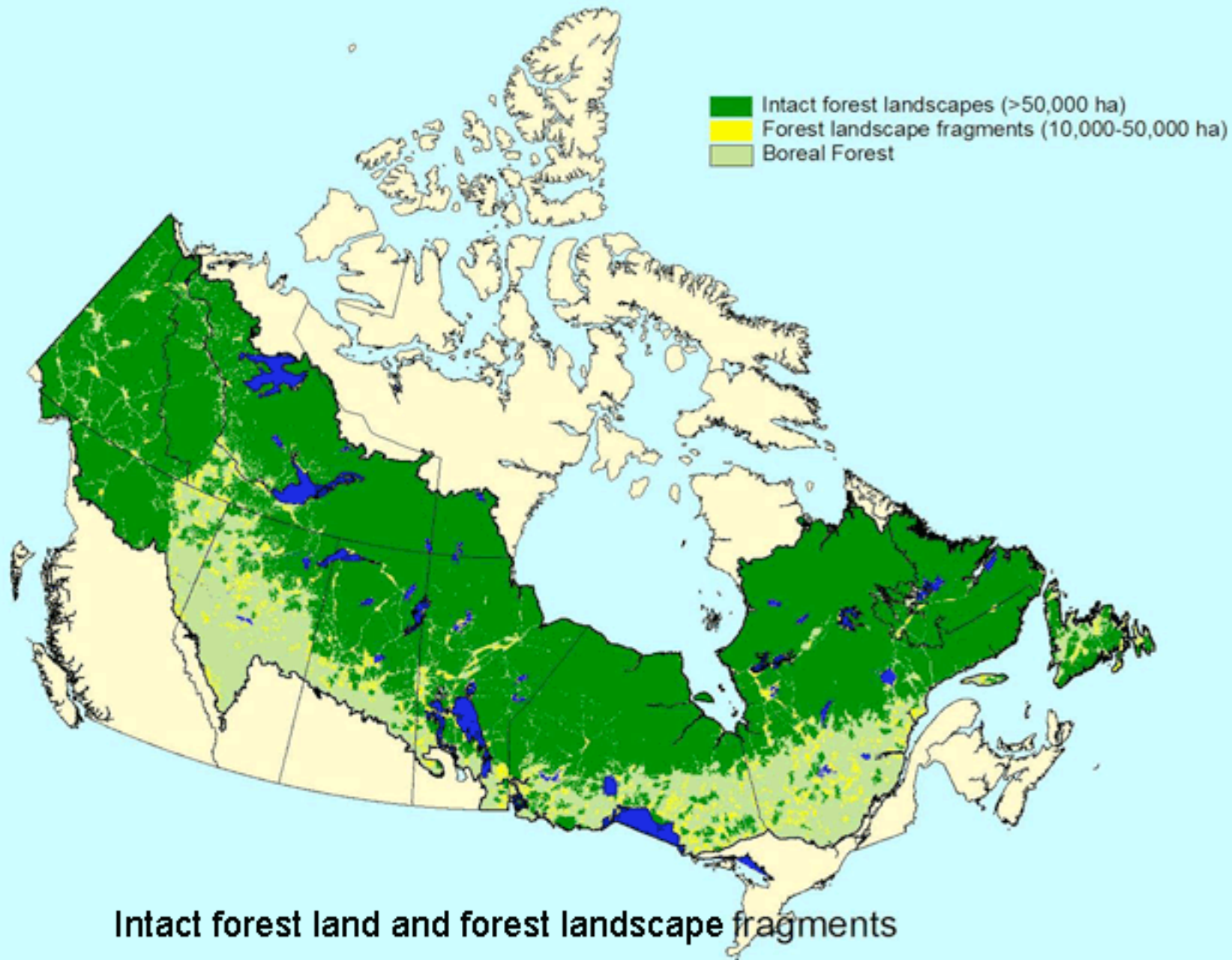
- Planning from a cultural perspective and respecting Indigenous science

# Context for Indigenous Leadership in Canada

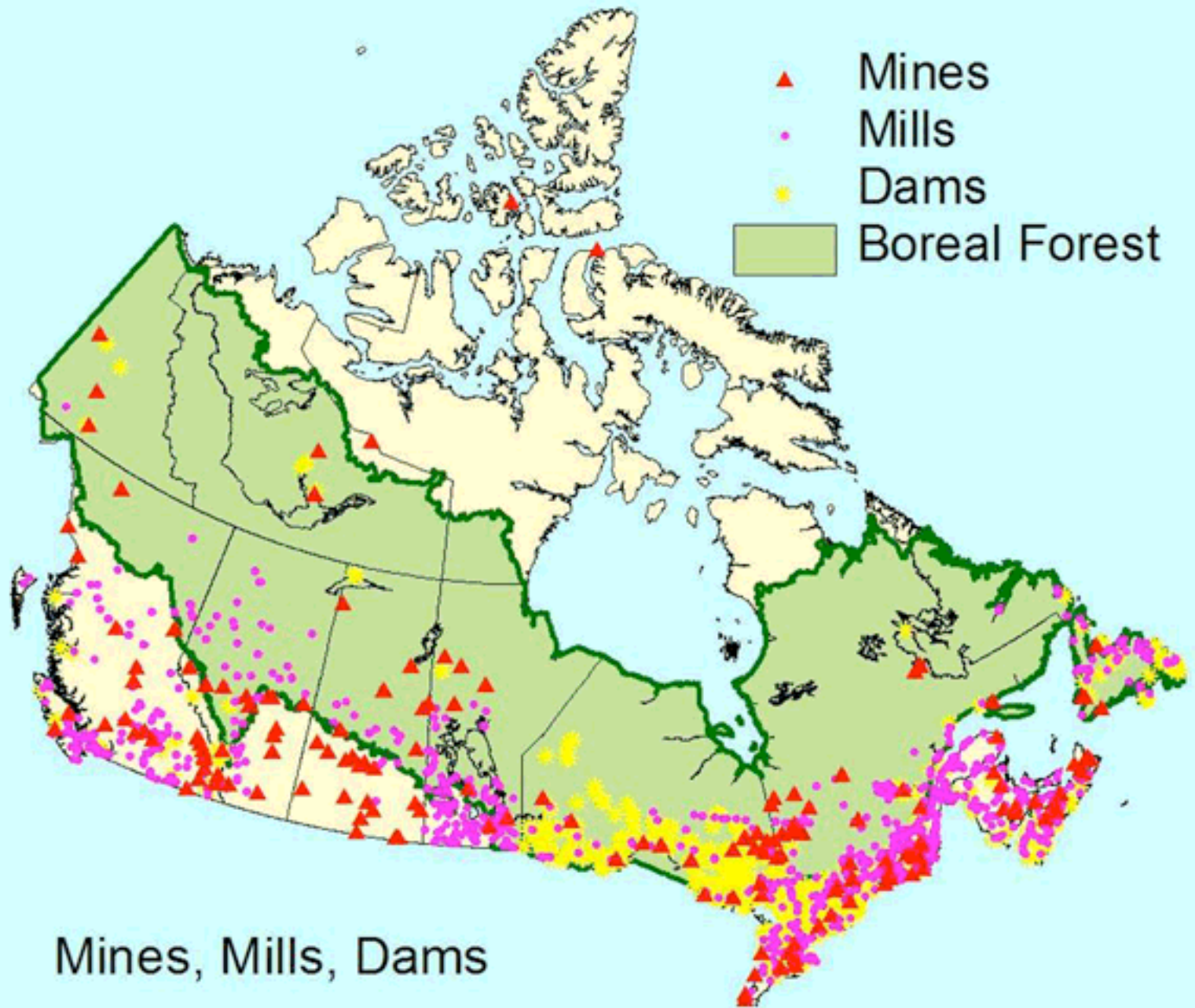
- Judicial recognition of Rights and Title

- Governance



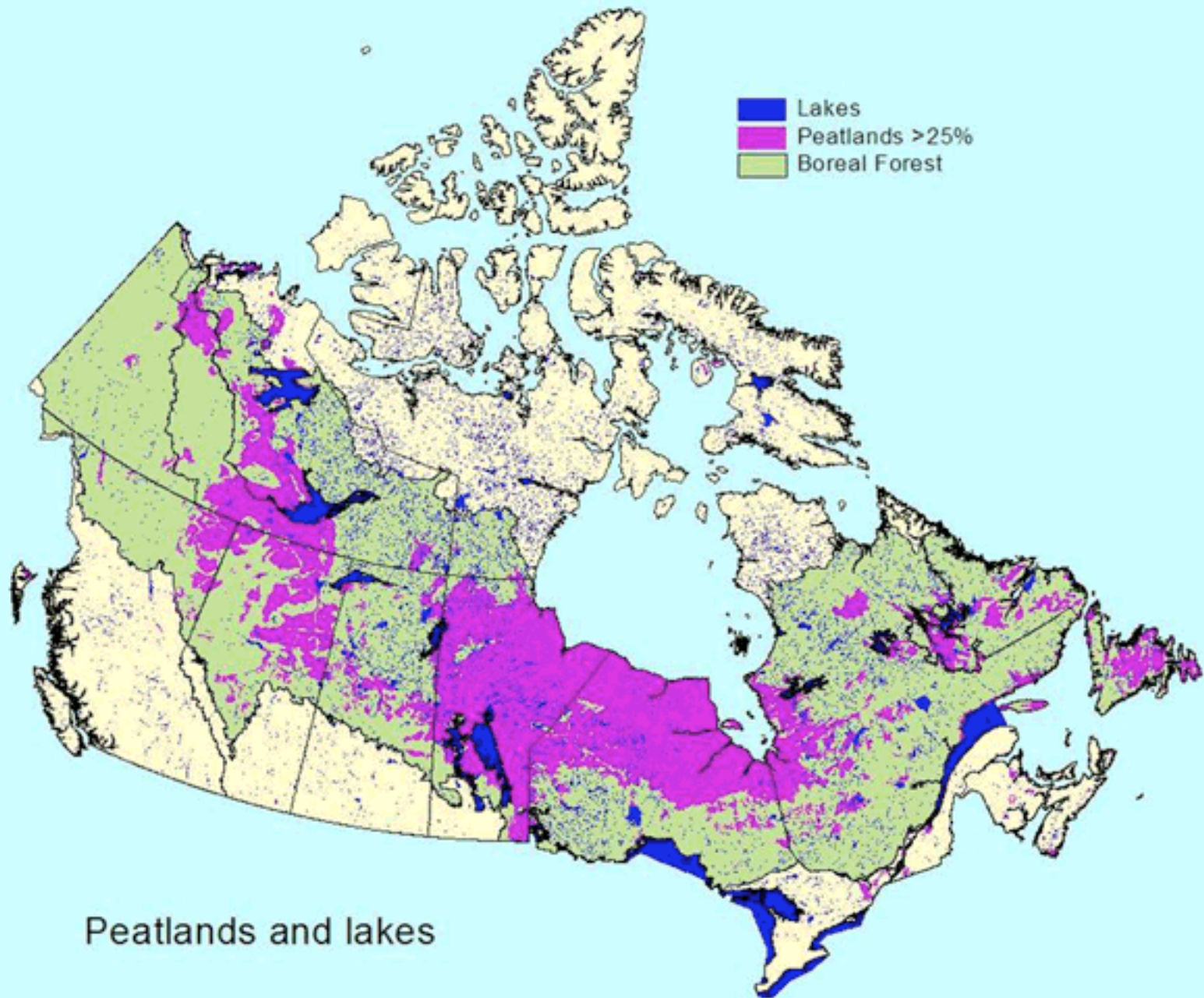




**Intact forest land and forest landscape fragments**

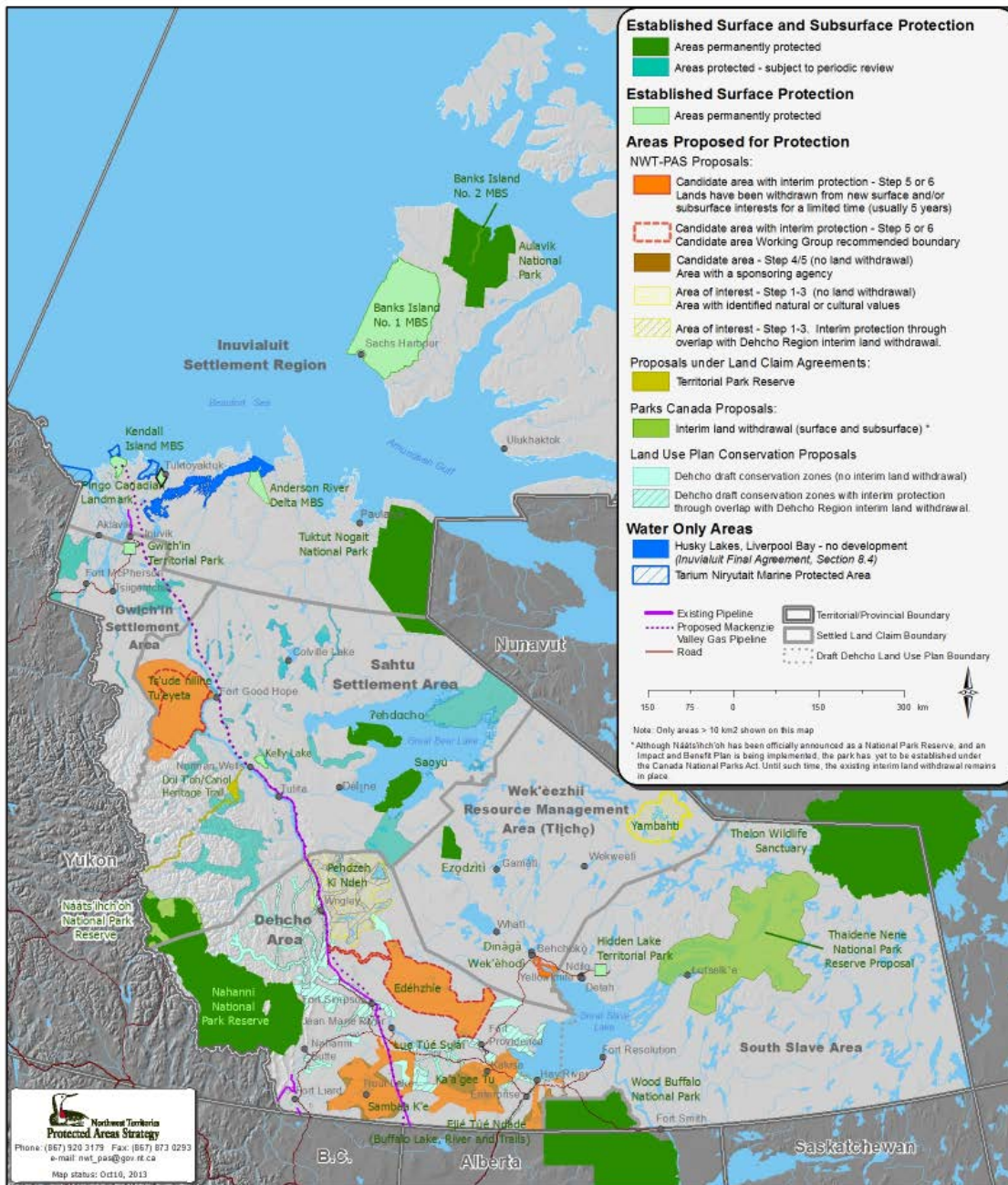


Mines, Mills, Dams
